**NOTICE OF COMPLAINT FOR APPROVAL (SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS'
CIVIL RELIEF ACT OF 1940) OF MORTGAGE FORECLOSURE**

and to all persons entitled to the benefits of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act of 1940.

The United States of America is the holder of a mortgage of real property with statutory power of sale, at 118 Cushman Road, Rochester, Plymouth County, Massachusetts, as follows. The mortgage was given by Sol Brothers, Inc. to the United States of America, acting by and through the Farm Service Agency, United States Department of Agriculture, dated April 27, 2007 and recorded in Book 34481 at Pages 322-328 of the Plymouth County Registry of Deeds.

The Farm Service Agency is successor to the Farmers Home Administration, United States Department of Agriculture.

The United States has filed in the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts a Complaint for authority under the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act of 1940 to foreclose the mortgage by entry and possession and by the exercise of a power of sale contained in the mortgage.

If you are entitled to the benefits of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act of 1940 and object to a foreclosure of the mortgage, you (or your attorney) should file an appearance and an answer in the United States District Court on or before sixty days from the date of service, or you may be forever barred from claiming that the foreclosure is invalid under the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act of 1940.
