STRAWBRIDGE: 9 10 Can you say how often in a given case --11 sorry -- how often in a given cycle someone presenting a candidate for admission might 12 mention ethnicity? 13 14 MS. ELLSWORTH: Objection. 15 It is hard to say. Α. BY MR. STRAWBRIDGE: 16 17 Can you give me any quantification at 18 all? Is it rare? 19 MS. ELLSWORTH: Objection. 20 I would say it is not often. Α. The 21 information is right there. 22 BY MR. STRAWBRIDGE: To what extent does Dean Fitzsimmons 23 24 participate in the individual candidate

12	Q. Perhaps not surprising to think that
13	people would be inclined to give a lot of weight
14	to his view, just by those reasons alone?

Can you give me an example of that, just 1 0. 2 off the top of your head? 3 MS. ELLSWORTH: Objection. 4 I will just remind the witness not to disclose any identifying information about any 5 students to that extent. 6 7 MR. STRAWBRIDGE: I don't want the names 8 of anybody. 9 MS. ELLSWORTH: Or any information that could make someone identifiable. 10 11 I can't recall the specific cases. BY MR. STRAWBRIDGE: 12 13 Q. You just know it has happened on 14 occasion? 15 Objection. MS. ELLSWORTH: 16 Α. Yes. 17 BY MR. STRAWBRIDGE: 18 What about Ms. McGrath? Does she 19 participate in the discussion of the individual candidates? 20 21 Α. Yes. 22 Do Dean Fitzsimmons and Ms. McGrath take an interest or participate at any level greater 23 24 than the other people in the room?

Yes. 15 Can it sometimes be a robust discussion 0. in terms of trying to make these decisions? 16 17 MS. ELLSWORTH: Objection. 18 Α. Yes. BY MR. STRAWBRIDGE: 19 And does Dean Fitzsimmons sometimes bring 20 Q. 21 forward people who he thinks that the committee 22 should consider or take another look at? MS. ELLSWORTH: Objection. 23 24 Α. Not usually.
