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## PLAINTIFFS EIGHT MILE STYLE, LLC AND MARTIN AFFILIATED, LLC'S NOTICE OF FILING OF SUPPLEMENTAL EVIDENCE

Plaintiffs Eight Mile Style, LLC ("Eight Mile") and Martin Affiliated, LLC ("Martin") (collectively "Plaintiffs") hereby submit this Notice of Filing of Supplemental Evidence in support of their Memorandum in Opposition to Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment.

1. Defendants Apple, Inc. and Aftermath Records d/b/a Aftermath Entertainment filed their Revised Motion for Summary Judgment on July 28, 2008. (Doc. No. 66.) Plaintiffs filed their Memorandum in Opposition to Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment on August 28, 2008. (Doc. No. 74.) Defendants filed their Reply brief on October 15, 2008. (Doc. No. 94.)

2. On August 12, 2008, plaintiffs served defendants with their Rule 26(a)(2) expert

disclosures. Defendants served rebuttal disclosures pursuant to Rule 26(a)(2) on September 11,

2008.

3. Defendants identified Peter Paterno in their expert disclosures as an individual who

would offer expert testimony regarding controlled composition clauses in artist recording

agreements, and as the individual who would offer evidence to contradict or rebut evidence offered

by plaintiffs' expert witnesses.

4. Plaintiffs requested that Mr. Paterno be made available for deposition, and Mr.

Paterno was finally deposed on Thursday, November 20, 2008.

5. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** is a short excerpt of the transcript of Mr. Paterno's

deposition, pages 79:4-80:14 of which, concerning defendants' practice of sending "license request

letters" to publishers when controlled composition language is ambiguous, are relevant to plaintiffs'

Opposition to defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment.

6. Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court take notice of their citation to this

supplemental authority.
