1 Introduction

1.1 Background and Experience

I am a tenured full professor of computer science at the University of California, Los Angeles. I earned a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering and computer science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1977, a masters degree in computer science from Carnegie-Mellon University in 1980, and a Ph.D. in computer science from Carnegie-Mellon in 1983. From 1983 to 1985 I was an assistant professor of computer science at Columbia University, and I have been on the UCLA faculty in computer science since 1985. My research area is artificial intelligence, and I have published over 130 scientific papers. In 1986 I was awarded a National Science Foundation Presidential Young Investigator Award, and I was elected a Fellow of the Association for the Advancement of Artificial Intelligence in 1994. I have been asked to provide my opinion on whether Firstlook's automated and manual filtering systems are designed to prevent the registration of internet domain names that may be confusingly similar to or identical to registered trademarks. I am being compensated at the rate of \$400.00 per hour. My compensation is not related to the outcome of this case.

1.4 Summary of Opinion

It is my opinion that Firstlook has put in place a combination of automated and manual procedures designed to avoid the registration of internet domain names that are identical to or confusingly similar to registered trademarks.

2 Process for Reviewing Candidate Domain Names

Firstlook is in the business of registering internet domain names that are likely to be visited by users. The corresponding pages are populated by advertisements, and when a user clicks on an ad on one of their pages, Firstlook earns some revenue from that click.
