JUDGMENT

On April 24, 2009, Plaintiffs filed a Complaint for Declaratory and Injunctive Relief against Defendants, challenging the Department of Homeland Security's charge against Lindon Dedvukaj, when he first arrived at the United States border in October 2000, of being an alien who falsely represented himself to be a citizen of the United States for any purpose or benefit under the Immigration and Nationality Act or any other Federal law or statute pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 212(a)(6)(C)(ii).
