ORDER

DENYING "PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER TO
BE ISSUED WITHOUT NOTICE PURSUANT TO FEDERAL RULE 65"

(Doc. 9)

AND

GRANTING "PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE FIRST AMENDED
COMPLAINT" (Doc. 10)

This is a civil rights case. Plaintiffs claim that defendants, the City of Roseville and employees, have subjected them to harassment due to their race. Plaintiffs have filed a "Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order to Be Issued Without Notice Pursuant to Federal Rule 65" essentially seeking a restraining order to cease the alleged harassment. (Doc. 9). Defendants oppose the motion, contending that plaintiffs have not met the standard for a restraining order. (Doc. 12)

Plaintiffs also filed a "Motion for Leave to File First Amended Complaint" (Doc. 10). Defendants oppose the motion on the grounds amendment would be futile. (Doc. 11).

On June 5, 2017 the Court held a status conference with the parties at which it discussed the pending motions. As stated at the conference, plaintiffs' motion for a temporary restraining order is DENIED. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 65. Plaintiffs' motion to amend is GRANTED. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 15.
