REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

Plaintiff filed this *pro se* civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. On May 15, 2009, the undersigned issued a Report and Recommendation recommending that plaintiff's complaint be dismissed for plaintiff's failure to keep this Court apprised of his current address.
