## Dear Judge Ericksen:

As a follow-up to my letter to the Court of January 6, 2011, and now that the Court has issued its Markman Order, defendants respectfully request that the pretrial schedule be modified for good cause to take account of the Court's claim constructions and provide the parties some additional time to prepare their expert reports and for dispositive motions. Counsel for TimeBase has indicated that it is not inclined to agree to any extensions.

For expert reports and expert discovery, defendants request that the current dates be extended for three weeks so that the experts can consider and apply the Court's constructions in connection with each of the 109 claims being asserted by plaintiff. In addition, defendants ask that the dispositive motion deadline—which currently is scheduled for ten days from now, February 4, 2011, which is before expert discovery is even scheduled to commence—be set for after the close of expert discovery. Finally, defendants ask that the trial date be moved until this fall consistent with this revised schedule.

With these extensions, the remaining pretrial deadlines would be adjusted as follows:
