2 moment.

3 But right now, lets take a look at all of last

6 MR. GREENBERG: Mike & Mike in the Morning on ESPN  
7 Radio, presented by the new AT&T, live on TV on ESPN2. Coming  
8 up in just a matter of moments, the funniest man in Hollywood.

10 (Announcement of "Just Shut Up")

11 MR. GREENBERG: If it's Tuesday, its the McDonalds  
12 Just Shut Up Award with Mike & Mike in the Morning, reminding  
13 you you can vote one of two ways for the Just Shut Up Award.  
14 First off, on ESPNRadio.com, or you can vote now for Just Shut  
15 Up from your cell phone. To vote that way, you can text MM to  
16 4ESPN, thats 4-3-7-7-6, standard text message rates do apply.

17 And if youre new to the program, every Tuesday we  
18 list the nominees and you make the decision on who in the  
19 world of sports most desperately needs to just shut up. And  
20 Golic, this week it begins -- I dont know what's going on with  
21 the position of wide receiver in the National Football League  
22 these days. What is going on with Jerry Porter and Oakland?

23 MR. GOLIC: Well, Jerry Porter basically said he  
24 didn't like what was going on out there, the way it was being

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1 run in Oakland with Art Shell taking over. He said his  
2 batteries didn't feel charged, and he was not going to be there  
3 in the off-season program.

4 He told Fred Biletnikoff, the wide receiver coach,

7 Jerry Porter says basically "I don't want to be  
8 here anymore, I want to be traded." He doesn't like what's  
9 going on, and he's not really a team leader out there, but the  
10 guy did last year get \$13 million up-front, Greenie. Now he's  
11 not happy.

12 Al Davis has come out and said, "Listen, I'm  
13 amenable to a trade, I'll trade him, not a problem." Here's the  
14 catch. Here's the catch, Greenie, we'll find out about how a  
15 player doesn't want to or wants to go how bad: If he gets  
16 traded because of the signing bonus he got last year, he's  
17 going to have to give back some of that signing bonus. He's  
18 going to have to give a little bit of a payback to the Raiders  
19 for that. And lets see if he's willing to do that and be  
20 traded.

21 MR. GREENBERG: How much money will it cost to  
22 charge his batteries? I suppose we'll find that out, and we  
23 will see if everybody decides today he deserves to just shut  
24 up.

1 Next, is a gentleman by the name of Trevor Graham.

2 He is the coach for track star Justin Gatlin, who apparently  
3 tested positive for something. And Trevor Graham, the coach,  
4 who is one of the Balco guys, --

5 MR. GOLIC: Right, also was the coach of Marion  
6 Jones. Remember, she got in a little bit of hot water.

7 MR. GREENBERG: The coach, Trevor Graham, claims  
8 that a massage therapist with an axe to grind --

9 MR. GOLIC: Yep.

10 MR. GREENBERG: -- rubbed testosterone cream on  
11 Justin Gatlin, and thats how Gatlin wound up testing positive.

12 MR. GOLIC: You know, you almost can't think of  
13 that. I mean, really. Yes, lets see, yeah, a massage  
14 therapist who had a grudge against Gatlin got some of the  
15 cream and massaged him with that. Yeah, yeah, yeah, that's why  
16 he tested positive. Thats a beaut there, isnt it? The thing  
17 about it is - the thing about it is: Lets be crazy and say  
18 "that happened."

19 MR. GREENBERG: Right.

20 MR. GOLIC: They still would have to prove it.  
21 They still have to prove it. Poor Justin Gatlin. If that is  
22 true, this guy is laying down for a massage, next thing you  
23 know, he's got more testosterone than God knows what, and he'll  
24 say "what the hell happened?"

1 MR. GREENBERG: You know what they call that in  
2 the massage world? An unhappy ending.

3 MR. GOLIC: Oh.

4 MR. GREENBERG: And then the final candidate for  
5 this weeks McDonald's Just Shut Up Award is cyclist Greg  
6 LeMond, who, when asked about the Floyd Landis controversy,  
7 basically used the opportunity to attack Lance Armstrong.  
8 There's no other way to say it.

9 MR. GOLIC: Yeah.

10 MR. GREENBERG: He didn't use the name Lance  
11 Armstrong, but he did -- Greg LeMond did say "this is an  
12 opportunity for Floyd Landis to change around the entire  
13 perception of cycling and our sport," instead of just denying  
14 and denying and denying like someone else we know.

15 MR. GOLIC: Like some other American rider that we  
16 know. And oh, by the way, for Floyd Landis, there's just a  
17 report coming out that some of the testosterone that came up  
18 in his test was synthetic testosterone, which doesn't bode well  
19 for his case that he had naturally high levels of  
20 testosterone.

21 So, but again, LeMond is up for the fact that he  
22 lumped in Lance Armstrong in saying he's, you know, another  
23 American rider who denies, denies, denies. Last we checked,  
24 Lance Armstrong has never tested positive.

15 well, I dont know what it is. Jerry Porter finishes in a tie  
16 for second place today. The receiver from the Raiders, he  
17 wants to trade because he says that his batteries are not  
18 charged up.

19 MR. GOLIC: Yeah, I struggled with that and not  
20 wanting to work out there with the Raiders in the off season.  
21 Basically, he wants to trade, and Al Davis said he may try and  
22 give him one.

23 MR. GREENBERG: He finishes tied with Trevor  
24 Graham, who is the coach of Justin Gatlin, the sprinter, and

3 cream on Gatlin.

4 MR. GOLIC: Beautiful.

7 LeMond, who this time, perhaps indirectly, but always seems to  
8 take the opportunity to throw Lance Armstrong under the bus.

9 And Mike, this week the people have spoken loudly,

12 MR. GREENBERG: -- proudly --

13 MR. GOLIC: Yes.

14 MR. GREENBERG: -- with one voice they have said  
15 "Hey Greg LeMond, just shut up."
