ORDER

This matter is before the Court on Petitioner's Motion for Order [5] filed December 8, 2010. In his Motion [5], Petitioner requests that this Court give his petition for habeas relief "high priority in the court's calendar." Having reviewed the Motion [5] as well as the record, this Court finds that the Motion [5] will be denied for the following reason.

A Final Judgment [4] was entered on December 8, 2010, dismissing the instant civil action prior to the Motion [5] being filed. Therefore, this Court is without jurisdiction to consider the merits of Petitioner's Motion [5]. <u>See United States v.</u> <u>Early</u>, 27 F.3d 140, 142 (5th Cir. 1994) (holding that a motion filed in a closed case is to be considered "a meaningless, unauthorized motion"). Even if the Motion [5] was filed prior to the Memorandum Opinion [3] and Final Judgment [4] on December 8, 2010, it is clear that the Motion [5] is moot and would be denied because a decision has been entered in the instant civil action. Therefore, as a initial matter this Court finds that there is no jurisdictional basis for Petitioner filing the instant Motion [5] and moreover, a decision concerning the instant habeas petition has been rendered. Consequently, the Motion [5] is denied. See

Id. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Motion [5] is **denied**.
