This matter is before the court on Plaintiff's Motions for Leave to Amend. (Filing Nos. <u>24</u> and <u>27</u>.) On December 20, 2013, the court granted Plaintiff leave to file a Second Amended Complaint. (Filing No. <u>19</u>.) Thereafter, Plaintiff has filed a Second Amended Complaint, three supplements, and two Motions requesting leave to amend his Second Amended Complaint. (Filing Nos. <u>22</u>, <u>23</u>, <u>24</u>, <u>25</u>, <u>26</u> and <u>27</u>.)

After careful consideration, the court will grant Plaintiff leave to file a third amended complaint. Plaintiff is directed to consolidate all of the claims contained in his past complaints, and any new allegations, into the third amended complaint. IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Plaintiff's Motions for Leave to Amend (filing nos. <u>24</u> and <u>27</u>) are granted. Plaintiff shall have until April 14, 2014, to file a third amended complaint.
- 2. The clerk's office is directed to set a pro se case management deadline using the following text: April 14, 2014: Deadline for Plaintiff to file a third amended complaint.
