MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

This matter is before the court on defendant Q.P. Corporation's ("QP") motion to dismiss for lack of personal jurisdiction, Filing No. <u>18</u>; defendant Henningsen Foods, Inc.'s ("Henningsen") motion to dismiss pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(6) and 12(d), Filing No. <u>22</u>; plaintiff's motion to strike, Filing No. <u>25</u>; plaintiff's motion to strike index, Filing No. <u>27</u>; Henningsen's motion to dismiss the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act ("RICO") claims, <u>18 U.S.C. § 1961</u> *et seq.*, Count II, Filing No. <u>38</u>; and plaintiff's motion to dismiss the RICO claims in Count II, Filing No. <u>46</u>.

The court first notes that plaintiff has now filed an Amended Complaint. Filing No. <u>36</u>. This new complaint renders Filing Nos. 18, 22, 25 and 27 moot. Accordingly, the court will deny those motions as moot. In addition, Henningson filed a motion to dismiss plaintiff's RICO claims. Filing No. <u>38</u>. Plaintiff has now filed a motion dismissing her RICO claims. Filing No. <u>46</u>. Accordingly, the court will grant the plaintiff's motion to dismiss her RICO claims and will deny Henningsen's motion to dismiss as moot.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. Henningsen's motion to dismiss, Filing No. <u>22</u>, is denied as moot.

2. Plaintiff's motion to strike, Filing No. 27, is denied as moot.

3. Plaintiff's motion to dismiss, Filing No. <u>46</u>, is granted and the RICO claims are dismissed from this lawsuit.

4. Henningsen's motion to dismiss the RICO claims, Filing No. <u>38</u>, is denied as moot.

5. Plaintiff's motion to strike, Filing No. <u>25</u>, is denied as moot.

6. QP's motion to dismiss, Filing No. <u>18</u>, is denied as moot.
