**MEMORANDUM AND ORDER**

This matter is before the Court on its own motion. Petitioner filed a Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus, [Filing No. 1](#), on January 17, 2023. However, Petitioner failed to include the \$5.00 filing fee. Petitioner has the choice of either submitting the \$5.00 fee to the Clerk's office or submitting a request to proceed in forma pauperis. If Petitioner chooses to do the latter, the enclosed pauper's forms should be completed and returned to this Court.<sup>1</sup> Failure to take either action within 30 days will result in the Court dismissing this case without further notice to Petitioner.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Petitioner is directed to submit the \$5.00 fee to the Clerk's office or submit a request to proceed in forma pauperis within 30 days. Failure to take either action will result in dismissal of this matter without further notice.


<sup>1</sup> In addition, if Petitioner wishes to proceed in forma pauperis, he is also obligated to "submit a certified copy of the trust fund account statement (or institutional equivalent) for the prisoner for the 6-month period immediately preceding the filing of the complaint or notice of appeal, obtained from the appropriate official of each prison at which the prisoner is or was confined." [28 U.S.C. § 1915\(a\)\(2\)](#).

2. The Clerk of the Court is directed to send to Petitioner the Form AO240 (“Application to Proceed Without Prepayment of Fees and Affidavit”).

3. The Clerk of the Court is directed to set a pro se case management deadline in this matter with the following text: **February 21, 2023**: Check for MIFP or payment.
