20	Come now Plaintiff UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and Defendant JAMES F.		
22	HOWARD, JR. ("Defendant"), by and through undersigned counsel, and submit this		
23	Stipulation and Joint Motion to extend the stay of further proceedings herein, including		
24	Plaintiff's Motion For Judgment On The Pleadings, for an additional period of forty-five (45)		
25			
26	days.		
27	In support of this Stipulation and Joi	int Motion, the parties submit the following:	
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1		1.	Since the last stipulation filed by the parties, Defendant JAMES HOWARD
2			("Defendant") and several representatives of the U.S. Forest Service have had a number
3			of meetings at the site of the property involved in this case ("subject property"). During
4			those meetings, those present discussed exactly what damages to the natural condition
5			of the subject property had been caused by Defendant's alleged trespasses. Also
6 7			discussed was the remedial steps the Forest Service believed needed to be taken in order
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9			to restore the subject property to its original, natural condition.
10		2.	As a result of these meetings, Defendant has, during the last sixty (60) days, undertaken
11			extensive reclamation work at and on the subject property, including hauling debris,
12			rocks, and trash away; leveling portions of the ground; relocating a equipment housed
13			on the subject property; and removing dead vegetation. The parties are pursuing those
14			details presently and need about sixty (60) days to finalize the details and for Defendant
15			to complete the remedial, corrective work.
16		4.	Defendant's remedial work has been followed by the representatives of the Forest
17 18			Service as the work has progressed and those representatives have given input,
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20			suggestions, and directions at various times during last sixty (60) days.
21		5.	Most of the heavy, time consuming work has been completed, but additional time is
22			needed to finalize and execute a plan of re-vegetation of the subject property. If all
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goes as the parties hope, this case will settle in its entirety during or at the conclusion of the requested additional forty-five (45) day stay.
