

1	granted; (3) balance of hardships; and (4) advancement of the public interest. <i>Winter v. N.R.D.C.</i> ,
2	129 S. Ct. 365, 374–76 (2008).
3	Here, plaintiffs claim that the defendant-lender has failed to provide "a proper valuation of
4	the property and to identify to plaintiffs the exact amounts due under the Mortgage." (Doc. #1,
5	compl. at \P 23). However, plaintiffs have not presented evidence that they have or are continuing to
6	make payments under the terms of the mortgage agreement. Thus, the court finds that the plaintiffs
7	have not demonstrated a likelihood of success on the merits nor have they demonstrated irreparable
8	injury as required under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65.
9	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that plaintiffs' motion for a
10	temporary restraining order (doc. #2) be, and the same hereby is, DENIED without prejudice.
