40 Dime NFL selection on the Ravens as a road underdog as they travel to the Falcons in a Thursday night NFC-AFC battle. Baltimore is a one-point underdog across the board both here in Vegas and offshore.

15 Dime NBA selection on the Nuggets as a home underdog as they host the Lakers at the Pepsi Center in a TNT showcase contest. Denver is catching three points on its home floor, and I expect this number to rise as the day progresses, so monitor any line movements and make sure you get the best possible take-back.

RAVENS

If you haven't heard it by now, I promise you'll hear it 30 times before kickoff: Matt Ryan is 17-1 as a starter at home, and his Falcons have won 18 of their last 21 games at the Georgia Dome (Ryan missed two games last year due to injury). Those are fantastic numbers, and I'm not going to try to poke holes in them, except to say this: The one team since the start of the 2008 season to win in Atlanta when Ryan started under center came from the AFC, and that was Denver (24-20 victory almost exactly two years ago).

The other AFC opponents the Falcons have faced (and defeated) over this 2½-year stretch: The Chiefs in 2008 (when Kansas City went 2-14); the Dolphins in last year's season opener (Miami went 7-9); the Bills in Week 15 last year (Buffalo went 6-10); and the Bengals two weeks ago (Cincinnati is 2-6 and has lost five games in a row).

Here's what I'm getting at: During Atlanta's incredible stretch of success at home, it simply has not been challenged by quality AFC opponents (even Denver in 2008 finished 8-8).

Well, the Ravens not only are a quality opponent; in my opinion, they're a Super Bowl contender. They sit at 6-2 on the season, and while their two losses came on the road, Baltimore played outstanding in both games. In a 15-10 loss at the Bengals in Week 2, the Ravens allowed just five field goals; they didn't win because QB Joe Flacco (17-for-39, 154 yards, 4 INTs) had arguably his worst game as a pro. Then three weeks ago, Baltimore took a 20-10 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter at New England, but played passively on offense the rest of the way, allowing the Patriots to rally to force overtime. Eventually, New England won 23-20 on a field goal with less than two minutes to go in the extra session.

That means the Ravens – who have had a fourth-quarter lead in every one of their games this season – are eight points away from being undefeated.

The counter-argument, of course, is that Atlanta is also 6-2 (including the perfect 4-0 home record), with one of its losses coming in overtime at Pittsburgh in Week 1. But since then, the Falcons have played seven times, losing once and pulling out four close games that could've gone the other way – a 16-14 home win over the 49ers (Atlanta got the winning field goal with 2 seconds to play); a 27-24 overtime win at New Orleans (the Saints missed a gimme field goal in overtime that would've won it); a 20-10 win at Cleveland (it was a three-point game with 4 minutes to play when the Falcons got an interception for a touchdown by a defensive lineman who made an incredibly acrobatic play); and then Sunday's 27-21 win over the Bucs (Atlanta stopped Tampa on a 4th-and-1 at the Falcons' 2-yard line with 90 seconds to play).

Granted, good teams find a way to win close games – and make no mistake, the Falcons are a good team. They're a very good team. That said, Baltimore ranks as one of the top four opponents Atlanta will have faced to this point in the season. The other three were the Saints, Steelers and Eagles, and the Falcons won one of those games (New Orleans) on a fluke in overtime, and lost the other two (Pittsburgh and Philadelphia) by a combined score of 46-26 while getting outgained by a combined 240 yards!

Note this, as well: The Saints, Eagles and Steelers all have outstanding defenses. Well, the Ravens come into this contest allowing only 17.4 points and 311 yards per game (206 passing); on the road, those figures dip to 15.2 points and 258.2 total yards per game (153 passing).

Put it all together and I just don't like this matchup for Ryan and the Falcons, especially with Flacco finally in a groove (he's got seven TDs and no INTs in his last three games, posting passer ratings of 119.3, 111.0 and 129.6). And the fact Atlanta is barely favored at home tonight – even when the Ravens have to travel on a short week – tells me I'm correct.

It almost certainly won't be easy, but I'm looking for Baltimore to pull this one out by 4 to 7 points.

NUGGETS

I full acknowledge that this is a "contrarian" play, as it's difficult to defend Denver – coming off an atrocious 144-113 loss to the Pacers – against the two-time defending champs (who are off to an 8-0 start and have won 10 in a row going back to the NBA Finals). But we've all watched the NBA long enough to know that the regular season is nothing more than a six-month series of quirky games and unexplainable results, and I wouldn't be the least bit surprised if Denver puts forth its best effort of the season tonight.

First off, every team in the NBA gets up to play Kobe and the Lakers, especially at home. And even though Carmelo Anthony isn't happy that he's still in Denver and might lay down like a dog at times this season, he will bring his A-game tonight – I have zero doubt about that. And the same goes for Chauncey Billups and the rest of the Nuggets.

Additionally, three of the Nuggets' four wins have come against quality competition (Dallas and Houston on the road; Utah at home). And three of its losses were to the Mavericks (home), Hornets (road) and Bulls (road) – all playoff squads – by a total of nine points. So yeah, Denver didn't show up (on defense, anyway) at Indiana on Tuesday – the second road game of a back-to-back, by the way – but that's the only time all season.

As for the Lakers, can't knock them one bit. They've picked up right where they left off in June, rolling to eight wins (5-3 ATS). However, six of their first eight contests were in Los Angeles, while the two road trips were easy journeys to Sacramento and Phoenix. So without question this will be the Lakers' toughest road test of the season (and arguably their toughest game of the season, as their opponents to date have been the Rockets, Suns, Warriors, Grizzlies, Kings, Raptors, Blazers and TWolves).

Three more points: The oddsmakers wildly overvalued the Lakers in these marquee Thursday games last year, as L.A. failed to cover in eight of its last nine, but Denver is 4-1 ATS in its last five on Thursday; 2) The Nuggets have covered in eight of their last 10 following a double-digit loss; and 3) Denver went 3-1 SU and 3-0-1 ATS last season against the Lakers, who are 2-5 ATS in their last seven trips to the Pepsi Center.

The Lakers aren't going 82-0, folks. They're going to have their hiccups along the way, and I say the first one comes tonight against a wounded Denver squad that – I believe – is eager to atone for Tuesday's disgraceful performance at Indiana.

Arizona State has been in every game except one this season, but the Sun Devils always seem to find a way to lose games against ranked opponents. Stanford has rattled off four straight wins since their loss at Oregon and have looked very good the last two weeks. Newton is living under a microscope now with all the speculation about him and his father in the recruiting process. But on the field, none of that matters as it's just him with his teammates. Those guys have dominated on the field this year. Scoring 113 points in the last two games and topping 50 points in four of the last six games and five of the 10 this season.

Newton leads the SEC in rushing with 1,146 yards and 15 TDs and he is second in the country in passing with 67 percent completions, 19 TDs and just five INTs. He has turned around the Auburn team and once he steps between the lines, he can let all the off-field stuff go.

Georgia got off to a horrible start without star WR A.J. Green, opening 1-4. They then won three straight games and had a shot at the SEC East crown, but a loss to Florida two weeks ago killed that idea. Now they have to worry about bowl eligibility and get a win either this

week against Auburn or in the finale against Georgia Tech.




The Bulldogs should be able to score points, it's just a matter of if they can score enough. Auburn is next-to-last in the SEC in passing defense, allowing 241 yards per game. Since Green has been back for Georgia, he has 32 catches for 510 yards and seven TDs. QB Aaron Murray has matured this season and when he controls the line of scrimmage with either play-action or the running game, Georgia is tough to beat.

Georgia has won four straight in this rivalry, cashing in three of the four. Last season the Bulldogs scored a 31-24 win as four-point favorites. The lone game the Bulldogs didn't cover was last time the two met at Auburn, winning 17-13 but coming up short as nine-point chalk.

Georgia is on ATS slides of 7-15-1 in SEC games, 3-7-1 after a spread-cover, 1-4 against winning teams and 1-4 as an underdog. Auburn is on positive ATS runs of 6-1 in SEC games, 4-1 at home, 5-2 overall and 4-0 after a non-cover.

Lay the points at home with Auburn as the Tigers have too much offense for Georgia.

The total in this contest is ranging from 61 to 62, and even though I fully expect this game to be played in at least the high 60s, it only makes sense to grab the lowest total you can find and give yourself the best opportuYnity to cash!

15 Dime college football selection on Colorado State plus the points at home against BYU. The Rams are a catching 6½ points both here in Vegas and offshore, and while I firmly beliZve Colorado State will be right there challenging for the outright win in the fourth quarter, let's be smart and buy the half-point, taking the spread to an even +7.

Michigan-Purdue OVER the total

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That includes last week's 67-65 triple-overtime win over Illinois, and even if you want to question that point total because the game went three extra sessions, well, Michigan still had 45 points at the end of regulation. Today, the Wolverines run up against a Purdue defense that has fallen on its face as the schedule has gotten more difficult (and opposing offenses have gotten more athletic). The Boilermakers held their first six opponents – the best of which was probably Northwestern – to just 20.5 ppg. But in the last three games, Purdue has surrendered 49, 44 and 34 points to Ohio State, Illinois and Wisconsin. And along with that 42.3 point-per-game average the Boilers have allowed nearly 394.3 total yards per game, including 181.3 rushing ypg.

So I repeat: Robinson (who will play today despite a mild head injury) and the Wolverines' offense are going to find the end zone early and often today. The only question is, can Purdue get its offense going? After a 23-12 season-opening loss at Notre Dame, the Boilers went on a 4-1 run and put up at least 20 points in every game (24.6 ppg). But in their three losses to Ohio State, Illinois and Wisconsin, they scored a grand total of 23 points while averaging a paltry 208.7 ypg. Now, because of injuries to their top two triggermen, the Boilermakers are forced to trot out a freshman QB for the second straight week.

Still, if ever Purdue was going to snap out of its offensive funk, it figures to be today, because Michigan's defense is beyond putrid. Since Big Ten play started, the Wolverines have allowed point totals of 35 (Indiana), 34 (Michigan State), 38 (Iowa), 41 (Penn State) and 65 (Illinois). I'll do the math for you: That's an average of 42.6 ppg! Even if you eliminate the 20 points Illinois scored in the three overtimes last week, that average is still 38.6 ppg!

In three road games this year – at Notre Dame, Indiana and Penn State – Michigan's defense has been gashed for 512.7 yards per contest, including 142.3 rushing ypg. Meanwhile, Purdue's offense has been much better at home this year; despite the 34-13 loss to Wisconsin last week, the Boilermakers are netting 23.2 points, 374.2 yards and – most importantly – 208.4 rushing yards per game in their house.

Put it all together and I'm very confident Purdue will move the ball today; they just have to find a way to get it across the goal line before turnYing it over (Purdue's QBs have combined for 12 interceptions this season, and the team has lost seven fumbles).

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Finally, yes, Purdue has trended toward the "under" recently (36-14-2 last 52 home games, 39-18-1 last 58 conference games; 12-3-1 last 16 as a home underdog). However, check out Michigan's "over" trends: 6-1 overall, 11-4 on the road, 5-1 as a favorite, 5-1 as a road favorite and 5-0 as a double-digit road chalk.

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No way in hell BYU should be laying points – nearly a touchdown no less! – on the road against any opponent, and I don't care that the Cougars have turned things around with three wins in their last four game. Hell, all three wins were in Provo, two of which were nail-biters (24-21 win over San Diego State, which got completely hosed by the officials and it cost them a win; 25-20 win over crappy Wyoming, which just lost to 0-8 New Mexico last week!).

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Compare the Cougars' road numbers to Colorado State's home numbers. The Rams are 3-1 SU and 4-0 ATS in Fort Collins, the only blemish being a 27-0 loss to TCU. Remove that contest from the ledger, and Colorado State has averaged 39 points and 523.3 yards per game (231.7 rushing) at home, while allowing just 19.3 points and 323.3 yards per game (119 rushing).

Again, how can BYU – which prior to last week against UNLV hadn't scored more than 25 points all year or won a game by more than five points – be favored on the road today? I just don't get it, especially since Colorado State is coming off a very strong shoZing at San Diego State last week – the Rams hung with the Aztecs (now 7-2) the entire way and fell 24-19 as an 18-point underdog.

Colorado State is on a 6-1 ATS roll, going 4-1 ATS as an underdog, and the Rams have covered in nine of 11 as a home 'dog. Yes, BYU has cashed in three of its last four games, but it remains in pointspread slumps of 1-4 against losing teams, 1-7 following a spread-cover and 2-5 when laying 3½ to 10 points.

If that's not enough, consider the fact that BYU – with a Top 25 team – barely eked out a 45-42 win its last trip to Fort Collins, failing to cover as a 15½-point favorite.




The Rams will cover this number, and I won't be the least bit shocked if they score the outright upset!
