

# EXHIBIT 56

**40 Dime Play** on the **TROY TROJANS** minus the points over Ohio. Troy is laying -2 or -2 1/2 points depending on your book. I want you to buy the 1/2 point down on this line if it goes up to -3 or -3 1/2.

**15 Dime Play** on **FLORIDA STATE** minus the points over Loyola Marymount. Florida State is laying -6 1/2 points in most books offshore and in Vegas.

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**TROY TROJANS** (be sure to buy the 1/2 point) --- Saturday's rather boring slate of football bowl games concludes this evening with the best value on the board... the Troy Trojans. Before I look at any numbers or records or common opponents, I want to point you to one thing. When I doubt, side with the best QB on the field. If it's close, either leave the game alone or play small on the slightly better QB (unless you have other HUGE determining factors leading you in one direction). Tonight we have a clear cut winner, and that's Troy QB Corey Robinson, and he alone will carry this team to a victory greater than three points.

Troy has a very good but little-known QB... a talent that Ohio University's defense hasn't seen yet. Not only that, but his receivers are more-talented and bigger than Ohio's defensive backfield and this mismatch simply can't be overlooked. Sure, Ohio's defense has been good all season if you look at their overall numbers, especially against ground games, but when you get to these bowl games you have to look at the talent on the field and now so much what they've done in the past vs. teams in their own conference. The MAC doesn't have a QB as talented as Robinson, in my opinion, and I just don't believe the Bobcats corners or safeties are athletic enough to keep up with Troy's wideouts. Advantage Troy. Big!!

This matchup definitely gives us a contrast in styles... as Troy wants to get up and down the field, eventually wearing out a defense and outscoring them in a high-scoring game. Ohio is a little more traditional, playing rather solid defense and pounding the ball on the ground. But let's not forget that the Trojans can run the ball too. Just because their passing game gets all the accolades doesn't mean they can't run the ball when they need to. For the season, Troy averaged over 150 rushing yards per game, with most of the damage coming from Shaun Southward. Don't sleep on Troy's ability to run the ball just because Corey Robinson gets all the praise... trust me, Troy will run the ball tonight too.

Troy enters tonight's game having beaten Florida International and Western Kentucky in their final two games, covering both and also playing their best defense in those two games. Ohio, on the other hand, suffered a humiliating 28-6 to lowly Kent State as 5-point favorites. They looked as bad as I remember them. There was a clear disconnect between QB Boo Jackson and the rest of his team, and that's one of the things I noticed and one of the reasons I liked Troy in this game when it was first released. Jackson finished the season with more INTs than TDs, but he's the only chance they have to win. If he doesn't play, Ohio will get destroyed tonight. I handicapped this game as if he were playing, which is why it's only a 40-dimer. If he doesn't play they are truly doomed because I just don't see how they'll score many points.

The Trojans are 5-2 ATS in their last 7 upon allowing less than 20 points in their previous game, 21-10 ATS in their last 31 games following a SU win and 7-3-1 ATS in their last 11 following an ATS win. Although they aren't playing a true home game, they are playing a lot closer to home than Ohio and both of these teams play a lot better at home. I'll give the edge here to Troy and subsequently the win and cover.

**FLORIDA STATE** --- Prove it to me first. I need to see if Loyola Marymount is really as good

as their record or just a product of their rather easy schedule. The toughest team the Lions have played thus far is probably Cal-Santa Barbara and, of course, they lost by 10. In fact, all of their "borderline" tough games resulted in losses and I still don't believe in them. They are definitely stepping up in competition tonight and I just don't think they can keep up with Florida State's length and athleticism.

Chris Singleton will be an absolute matchup nightmare for every player on the floor in a Lions jersey and I wouldn't be surprised if he's on his way to a double-double by halftime. Loyola has no one on its roster that can stop him one-on-one, and when they start to double down he is more than capable of finding the open shooter for the perimeter jumper. And considering the Seminoles shoot better than 40% from three-point land on the road, that's going to spell trouble for the Lions at home. FSU not only scores more, they play very good team defense with their athletic front court.

FSU didn't beat Ohio State, but they sent a message by playing a very physical game and allowing the #2 team in the country to score just 58 points. If OSU can only score 58, how can Loyola be expected to top that? The 'Noles are 9-2 ATS in their last 11 as a road favorite of between 1 and 7 points and 8-3 ATS in their last 11 as a road favorite in general. The buck stops here as FSU is just too strong for Loyola.

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Yes, I know South Carolina is 7-1 on the season and its only loss came at Michigan State by nine points, but have you seen some of their wins??? USC-Upstate, Wofford, Radford, Elon, Delaware State... the list goes on. They haven't played anyone EXCEPT Michigan State, and in that game they lost. Isn't it ironic that MSU was giving 17 points in that game as well and although they won South Carolina easily covered, yet Vegas comes right back with that number against another Big Ten team? They are BEGGING for South Carolina money people, and I'm not going to be fooled.

Jared Sullinger, the freshman phenom, is averaging 17 points and 9 rebounds per game this season and I don't think we've seen anything close to his best yet. This team is balanced, high-powered on offense and very suffocating on defense. Not only are they completely outscoring everyone, they're outrebounding them and not turning the ball over. Unless they completely collapse today, I see them winning this thing easily by 20 or more.

Time for the Knicks, following consecutive homes losses to the Celtics and Heat that ended their eight-game winning streak, to rebound with a road win against the Cavaliers, snapping an eight-game losing streak against Cleveland, a streak compiled when LeBron was averaging 33 ppg.

Speaking of James, he torched New York last night at the Garden with a triple-double (32 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists) as his new team, Miami, rolled 113-91. The contest marked the end of Amare Stoudemire's streak of nine straight games with 30+ points and came just two nights after the Knicks almost upset Boston at home.

Tonight the Knicks carry an eight-game road winning streak into Cleveland against the Cavaliers, who have lost 10 in a row by an average of 17.5 points. They've shot just 40.1% during the skid and are coming off a 108-99 loss at Indiana last night, their 14th overall in the past 16 games.

New York was held to 34 points in the second half by the Heat last night. Don't expect a repeat performance against the Cavs as the Knicks average 108.1 points on the season.

Cleveland couldn't handle the Pacers' Danny Granger last night (30 points, 12 rebounds); the Cavs can't contend with Stoudemire, Wilson Chandler (19.5 ppg since joining the starting lineup), Raymond Felton (18.3 ppg or the Knicks' depth tonight. And two of their top defenders, Joey Graham and Leon Powe, missed Friday's loss at Indiana and will most likely remain sidelined today.

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

This number has been all over the place over the past 48 hours, so make sure you get the maxiYum underdog value possible with Utah. And if you can get the full 17 points, obZiously that's a key number in college football.

## UTAH

This pointspread took a big plunge on Tuesday, dropping from a high 18 in some spots all the way down to 15 in some spots. The main reason? It's been raining cats and dogs here in Vegas since early Monday and the forecast is for the precipitation to continue all day today. Throw in some wind, and it's easy to understand why so much sharp money has come in on Utah over the past 48 hours.

But there's more at play here than just the weather. This pointspread was inflated to begin with – for Boise State, a team disappointed to be playing in the Las Vegas Bowl pre-Christmas when they had the Broncos had their sights set on the BCS championship game (or at least a BCS Bowl game) all season, to join Oklahoma (vs. UConn) as the biggest favorites of the entire bowl season? Against a Utah squad that went 10-2 SU and 7-4-1 ATS and has won nine straight bowl games (the longest active streak in college football)? It never made any sense to me.

Sure, I'm aware that Utah is without starting quarterback Jordan Wynn (the sophomore is out with a shoulder injury). But it's not as though his backup is some freshman slouch. Terrance Cain is a senior who's been with the Utes the last two years. Last year in limited action, he completed 63.7 percent of his passes for 1,624 yards, 11 TDs and 5 INTs while adding 318 rushing yards and two additional scores. This year, he appeared in a handful of games and went 51-for-72 for 610 yards with six TDs and two picks.

True, Cain's numbers pale in comparison to Boise State junior Kellen Morrow (3,506 passing yards, 33 TDs, 5 INTs). And Cain and the Utes will be facing one of the best defenses in college football (Boise State allowed 13.6 points and 264.1 total yards per game, including 155.8 passing yards per game, in the regular season). But Utah's defense isn't exactly a joke. The Utes yield just 19.8 points and 319.7 total yards per game, and their rushing defense (104.2 ypg) is better than Boise's (108.3 ypg).

And while Utah gave up 34 points to San Diego State and 47 points to TCU (the two best teams the Utes faced), Boise's defense was exposed against its three toughest opponents: Virginia Tech put up 30 (in a neutral-site season-opener); Oregon State scored 24 (at Boise); and Nevada put up 34 (in Reno, handing the Broncos their only loss of the season). Well, Utah's offense scored 27 points or more in nine of 12 games (winning all nine).

Now, I know most people supporting Boise State will point to one game to support their argument: Utah's 47-7 home loss to TCU back on Nov. 6, a defeat that ended the Utes' perfect season. I was on TCU with a 40 Dime play that day, and it was one of the easiest winners I had all year in college football. Is Boise State as good as TCU? Probably. So what makes me think the Broncos won't have similar success against Utah? Because the Utes have had three full weeks to prepare for this game, and you know they don't want to get embarrassed on a national stage again.

Back to Utah's bowl winning streak: It's not like the Utes have been beating up on patsies from the Sun Belt conference or something. Look at some of the victims: Fresno State and USC (in the 1999 and 2001 Las Vegas Bowls); Pittsburgh and Alabama (in BCS bowls); and Georgia Tech, Navy and California. The Utes have averaged 33.5 ppg in the last six bowl wins (scoring 30-plus points in five of the games), and they've held seven of their nine bowl victims to 17 points or less, including Fresno State (16), USC (6), Pitt (7), Georgia Tech (10), Tulsa (13) and Alabama (17).

Utah has cashed in seven of its last eight bowls, going 4-0 SU and ATS as an underdog. The Utes are also 27-8-1 ATS in their last 36 as an underdog overall, including 5-1 ATS in their

last six when catching more than 10 points.

Throw in the fact that you have seriously question Boise State's motivation tonight – again, this was a team that as recently as three weeks ago was undefeated and talking national championship – and the only way to roll in this game is with the underdog (and by the way, the underdog is 5-1 ATS in the last six Las Vegas Bowls).

## OREGON

Let's go over a few undisputed facts.

Fact: Last year, Oregon was a four-point favorite over Ohio State in the Rose Bowl and lost outright 26-17, finding the end zone just twice after scoring 43, 47, 42, 44, 44 and 37 points in its last six regular-season games (all against Pac-10 opponents).

Fact: Multi-threat Ohio State quarterback Terrell Pryor torched the Ducks defense for 338 combined rushing and passing yards.

Fact: Auburn QB Cam Newton is better than Terrell Pryor and, playing in the SEC this season, obliteXated much better defenses than Pryor did playing in the Big Ten.

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So why do you think this is? Why do you think a team from the "weak" Pac-10, one that got dominated by a Big Ten opponent in the Rose Bowl 53 weeks ago, is getting so much support even though they're facing the big, bad SEC and big, bad Cam Newton? Answer: While the Tigers will have the single best player on the field tonight, Oregon will have the better overall *team* – we're talking offense, defense and special teams. And for everyone who argues "yeah, but the Ducks haven't faced an athlete as dynamic as Newton," I'll coYunter with "yeah, but Auburn hasn't seen an offense as fast-paced with as much electrifying speed/home-run-hitting ability as Oregon."

And to me, the Ducks' quick-tempo offense will prove to be the difference as they wear down an Auburn defense that has been had multiple times this season. Yes, the Tigers held South Carolina to just 17 points in the SEC championship game on Dec. 4. However, that was more a product of the Gamecocks self-destructing than anything else. Prior to that, Auburn allowed 27 points (24 in the first half) to Alabama, 31 to Georgia, 31 to Ole Miss, 43 to Arkansas, 34 to Kentucky and 27 to South Carolina in a regular-season contest.

You know what the common thread was in each of those six games (plus a 17-14 win at Mississippi State in Week 2 and a 27-24 overtime home win over Clemson)? Auburn trailed in every single contest – and often trailed BIG – barely escaping against Mississippi State, Clemson, at Alabama (28-27), at Kentucky (34-31) and at home vs. South Carolina (35-27). Even the 65-43 win over Arkansas was misleading (Arkansas led 43-37 with less than 12 minutes to play).

Of course, Auburn supporters will point to those eight wins as proof that the Tigers are resilient and NEVER out of a contest. I'll acknowledge that ... so long as those who make

that argument will agree that A) Auburn has been playing with fire all season long and B) the reason the Tigers had to rally so frequently was because their defense was so often terrible, particularly a young secondary that got burned countless times by some pretty pedestrian quarterbacks (outside of Alabama's Greg McElroy and Arkansas' Ryan Mallett, Auburn really didn't face a quality passer all season).

Well, Oregon's Darron Thomas (2,500 yards, 28 TDs, 7 INTs) is an outstanding passer and he's absolutely loaded with weapons to his left, right and behind him. Thomas led an offense that accomplished a slew of incredible feats this year (including scoring 43 points or more 10 times in 12 games). The most impressive stat? The Ducks had more than 20 scoring drives of three plays or less this season!

While we're on the topic of impressive stats, although it got lost in the shadow of its incredible offense, the Oregon defense was outstanding this year, allowing just 18.4 points and 327.8 total yards per game. Admittedly, the Ducks did surrender 29, 32, 31 and 31 points to Arizona, USC, Stanford and Arizona State. But they still managed to win each of those games by double digits (42-31 at Arizona State; 52-31 vs. Stanford after trailing 24-0; 53-32 at USC; 48-29 vs. Arizona).

In fact, while six of Auburn's victories were by eight points or less (including two by a field goal and one by a single point), Oregon was challenged just once: a 15-13 win at Cal. It absolutely was a horrible performance by the Ducks that night in Berkeley ... but it was their ONLY one of the entire season!

Bottom line: I'm not going to dump on Auburn, because it has had a tremendous season, and there's no question Newton is one of the most exciting college football players of all time. But this Oregon team is on a mission. It is on a mission to avenge last year's Rose Bowl stinker against USC. It is on a mission to avenge that 19-8 loss at Boise State to start last season. It is on a mission to prove it (and the Pac-10 in general) can play championship-caliber football.

And even though I wouldn't be surprised if the Ducks got down early (they started slow several times over the second half of the season), I have no doubt in my mind they'll be the one left standing in the end.
