16 **STIPULATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME FOR PLAINTIFF TO**
 17 **RESPOND TO DEFENDANTS' MOTIONS FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT**

18 **(FIFTH REQUEST)**

19 Pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 6(b) and the Court's Local Rule of
 20 Civil Practice ("LRCP") 7-1, the parties respectfully request that the Court extend the current
 21 deadline for Plaintiff to respond to Defendants' motions for summary judgment (Pacer #109 and
 22 #110) to and until May 30, 2017 (Tuesday). This is the parties' fifth request for an extension of
 23 time. Plaintiff's current deadline is May 23, 2017.

24 In support of this stipulation, the parties wish to advise the Court of the following:

- 25 1. This is a civil rights case involving five separate Defendants. Each
 26 Defendant moved for summary judgment on January 30, 2017.

1 2. Plaintiff's counsel, Paul S. Padda, Esq. recently requested (via joint
2 stipulation) an extension of time which the Court approved. Unfortunately, Mr. Padda became ill
3 late last week and has had very limited involvement in office matters since that time.

4 Undersigned counsel for Plaintiff spoke to Mr. Padda today who continues to experience illness
5 and is expected away from the office for part of this week in an effort to recuperate. Due to
6 undersigned counsel's limited involvement in this case, he is not in a position to complete
7 Plaintiff's response to the pending motions for summary judgment.

8 3. Upon learning of the current deadline, undersigned counsel immediately
9 contacted counsel for Defendants have graciously indicated that they do not oppose Plaintiff's
10 request for additional time to respond to the dispositive motions provided they are allowed 30-
11 days to file a reply to any response that may be filed by Plaintiff. Obviously, Plaintiff's counsel
12 has no issue with providing Defendants additional time to file replies.

13 4. The additional time requested herein should provide sufficient time for
14 Plaintiff's counsel to complete and file appropriate responses after he recovers from illness and is
15 able to return to the office on regular schedule.

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
