ORDER EXTENDING BRIEFING ON MOTION FOR ENTRY OF CLERK'S DEFAULT (#51) AND THE TIME FOR COMPLETING JURISDICTIONAL DISCOVERY

On January 5, 2015, a hearing was held on an Emergency Motion to Withdraw (#59) by counsel for Defendants Anthony Spann and Joseph Corpuz. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the time for completing jurisdictional discovery and set by the Stipulation and Order to Extend Time to Complete Jurisdictional Discovery (#57) is extended from February 2, 2015, to March 2, 2015, and the time for Defendants to file any Supplemental Motion to Stay

is extended to March 9, 2015.
