**Order Accepting Report and
Recommendation and Dismissing Case**

(Dkt. ## 16, 17, 27)

11 On August 10, 2015, Magistrate Judge Koppe entered her Report and Recommendation
12 (Dkt. #27) recommending that plaintiff's Motion for Reversal and/or Remand (Dkt. #16) be denied
13 and that defendant's Cross-Motion to Affirm (Dkt. #17) be granted. No objection has been filed to
14 that Report and Recommendation. Thus, I am not required to conduct "any review at all . . . of any
15 issue that is not the subject of an objection." *Thomas v. Arn*, 474 U.S. 140, 149 (1985). The Ninth
16 Circuit has confirmed that a district court is not required to review a magistrate judge's report and
17 recommendation where no objection has been filed. *See United States v. Reyna-Tapia*, 328 F.3d
18 1114, 1121 (9th Cir. 2003) ("[T]he district judge must review the magistrate judge's findings and
19 recommendations de novo if objection is made, but not otherwise."); *see also Schmidt v. Johnstone*,
20 263 F. Supp. 2d 1219, 1226 (D. Ariz. 2003) (Based on *Thomas* and *Reyna-Tapia*, "district courts
21 are not required to conduct any review at all . . . of any issue that is not the subject of an objection.").
22 Because there is no objection to a magistrate judge's recommendation, I may accept the
23 recommendation without review.

24 Nevertheless, I have conducted a de novo review of the issues set forth in the Report and
25 Recommendation pursuant to Local Rule IB 3-2. Judge Koppe's Report and Recommendation sets
26 forth the proper legal analysis, and the factual basis, for the decision. Therefore,
