A party may file specific written 19 objections to the findings and recommendations of a magistrate judge. 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1); Local 20 Rule IB 3-2(a). When written objections have been filed, the district court is required to "make a de novo determination of those portions of the report or specified proposed findings or 21 recommendations to which objection is made." 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1); see also Local Rule IB 3-22 2(b). Where a party fails to object, however, a district court is not required to conduct "any review," 23 de novo or otherwise, of the report and recommendations of a magistrate judge. Thomas v. Arn, 24 474 U.S. 140, 149 (1985). 25
