This matter is before the Court on the parties' Proposed Discovery Plan and Scheduling Order. Docket No. 8. The proposed discovery plan misstates Local Rule 26-4, in that it provides that requests to extend deadlines in the scheduling order need only be filed 21 days before the discovery cut-off. *See* Docket No. 8 at 3. Local Rule 26-4 requires that any request to extend deadlines set forth in the scheduling order must be submitted at least 21 days <u>before the subject</u> <u>deadline</u>. For example, any request to extend the deadline for initial expert disclosures must be filed at least 21 days before the expiration of <u>that deadline</u>. Such a request filed only 21 days before the discovery cut-off would be untimely.
