

ORDER

This matter is before the court's review of the docket in this case. Plaintiff's Complaint (Dkt. #5) was filed on May 12, 2015. No answer has been filed. Canon 3C(1)(c) of the Code of Conduct for United States Judges and 28 U.S.C. § 455(b)(4) require the court to screen cases for financial disqualification or other financial matters that may call for a judge's recusal. Accordingly, Plaintiff shall file a notice with the court disclosing all persons, associations of persons, firms, partnerships or corporations (including parent corporations) that have a direct, pecuniary interest in the outcome of the case. If there are no known interested parties other than those participating in the case, a statement to that effect must be filed. Additionally, Plaintiff must promptly file a supplemental notice upon any change in the information contained in the notice. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that Plaintiff shall file a notice with the court disclosing all persons, associations of persons, firms, partnerships or corporations (including parent corporations) that have a direct, pecuniary interest in the outcome of the case **no later than 4:00 p.m., June 22, 2015**. Failure to comply may result in the issuance of an order to show cause why sanctions should not be imposed.
