ORDER

Presently before the court is pro se plaintiff Annette Walker-Goggins’s motion to bound over to the federal district court. (ECF No. 28).

This is an appeal of the Social Security Administration’s denial of benefits. Plaintiff’s motion is hard to follow. It can best be construed as a request for the federal district court to hear her case. But Magistrate Judge Hoffman has already screened plaintiff’s claims (ECF No. 8), noting that “[t]he facts alleged in plaintiff’s complaint are difficult to follow and incomprehensible,” and are “incoherent, fanciful, and delusional.” (*Id.* at 2–3). Judge Hoffman recommended the complaint be dismissed with prejudice and this court adopted that recommendation. (ECF No. 13). This case has been closed since May 19, 2016, and plaintiff’s numerous post-judgment motions have all been denied. (Judgment, ECF No. 14). Furthermore, plaintiff does not cite any legal authority that supports her requests. The failure of a party to file points and authorities in support of a motion constitutes consent to the denial of the motion. LR 7-2(d).
