Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 6(b)(1)(A), the Court may extend the time to perform an act within a specified time for good cause shown.

On October 10, 2018, the parties participated in a settlement conference at which a settlement was reached to resolve this matter in its entirety. See ECF No. 92.
