ORDER

Pending before the Court is an order for Defendant to show cause why case-dispositive sanctions should not be entered. Docket No. 56. ¹ The plaintiff has the burden of “proving up” his damages to be awarded in a default judgment. *See, e.g., Dolphin v. Ruiz*, 2008 WL 4552940, *3 (C.D. Cal. Oct. 9, 2008). Generally speaking, such damages are proven up through the submission of evidence (such as in a declaration) or through an evidentiary hearing. *See id.*
