Plaintiff Jacquelynn Bortolamedi brings this action to challenge the Social Security Commissioner's denial of her request for disability-insurance benefits under Titles II and XVI of the Social Security Act. The magistrate judge has evaluated the briefing in this case and 12 recommends that I grant in part and deny in part Bortolamedi's motion for judgment on the 13 pleadings²; remand this case for further proceedings regarding Drs. Hodde, Austin, and Madow's 14 opinions and the vocational expert's testimony; and deny the Commissioner's cross-motion to 15 affirm. The deadline for objections to that recommendation passed without objection or any 16 request to extend the deadline to file one. "[N]o review is required of a magistrate judge's report and recommendation unless objections are filed."4

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the magistrate judge's report and recommendation [ECF No. 25] is ADOPTED in full;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the motion for judgment on the pleadings [ECF No. 13] is GRANTED in part and DENIED in PART, consistent with the report and recommendation [ECF No. 25], and the Commissioner's cross-motion to affirm [ECF No. 18] is 4 DENIED. This case is REMANDED for further proceedings regarding Drs. Hodde, Austin, 5 and Madow's opinions and the vocational expert's testimony.
