The order 17 gave plaintiff until November 3, 2017 to file an amended complaint. On October 17, 2017, plaintiff 18 mailed a pro se filing to the court requesting an extension of time to file his amended complaint. 19 (ECF No. 8). The court granted plaintiff's motion. (ECF No. 9). 20 On December 1, 2017, plaintiff mailed a second pro se filing to the court requesting an 21 extension of time to file his amended complaint. (ECF No. 10). According to plaintiff's motion, 22 he has attempted to diligently pursue amending his complaint but has run into trouble gathering 23 evidence. Id. Given his self-representation, he submits that he currently does not have enough
