ORDER v. 8 STATE OF NEVADA, et al., 9 Respondents. 10 On December 4, 2018, the court granted respondents' motion to dismiss certain grounds in 11 Ossiris Dizon Lynch's pro se 28 U.S.C. § 2254 habeas petition (ECF No. 12). The court noted in 12 that order that Lynch had not opposed the motion to dismiss or responded in any way. 13 That order was served on Lynch via U.S. mail at his address of record. The order was 14 returned as undeliverable, with no new address (see ECF No. 13).
