Pending before the Court is Defendants' motion to extend the deadlines in the scheduling order by 120 days. Docket No. 13. Plaintiff filed a response in opposition, and Defendants filed a reply. Docket Nos. 15, 17. The motion is properly decided without a hearing. *See* Local Rule 78-1.
