Because she was 11 granted in forma pauperis status, the court screened her complaint; upon doing so, it dismissed 12|| her complaint with a detailed explanation of its deficiencies and gave O'Brien leave to amend. 1 13 Though O'Brien filed an amended complaint, it lacks allegations that would invoke this court's 14 limited, federal jurisdiction; indeed, its allegations demonstrate that this court lacks jurisdiction 15 to resolve O'Brien's claims. So Magistrate Judge Albregts recommends that I dismiss this action 16 with prejudice. The deadline for objections to that recommendation passed without objection or 17 any request to extend the deadline to file one. "[N]o review is required of a magistrate judge's 18 report and recommendation unless objections are filed."³ 19 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the magistrate judge's report and recommendation [ECF No. 9] is ADOPTED in full; 21 ¹ ECF No. 4. ² ECF No. 8. ²³ Schmidt v.
