**Order Adopting Report and  
Recommendation and Dismissing Case**

[ECF No. 9]

9 Brenna O'Brien brings this action against her former employer, Wynn Las Vegas, LLC,  
10 for defamation, intentional infliction of emotional distress, and negligence. Because she was  
11 granted *in forma pauperis* status, the court screened her complaint; upon doing so, it dismissed  
12 her complaint with a detailed explanation of its deficiencies and gave O'Brien leave to amend.<sup>1</sup>  
13 Though O'Brien filed an amended complaint,<sup>2</sup> it lacks allegations that would invoke this court's  
14 limited, federal jurisdiction; indeed, its allegations demonstrate that this court lacks jurisdiction  
15 to resolve O'Brien's claims. So Magistrate Judge Albregts recommends that I dismiss this action  
16 with prejudice. The deadline for objections to that recommendation passed without objection or  
17 any request to extend the deadline to file one. "[N]o review is required of a magistrate judge's  
18 report and recommendation unless objections are filed."<sup>3</sup>

19 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the magistrate judge's report and recommendation  
20 [ECF No. 9] is **ADOPTED** in full;
