16 **DEFENDANT YUNEEQ USA, INC.’S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**
17 **TO RESPOND TO PLAINTIFF’S COMPLAINT**

18 **(FIRST REQUEST)**

19 Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure (“FRCP”) 6(b)(1)(A) and the Court’s Local
20 Rule 7-2, Defendant Yuneeq USA, Inc. (“Yuneeq”) respectfully requests a 14-day extension of
21 time, to and until April 17, 2018, to respond to Plaintiff’s Complaint. Yuneeq’s response is due
22 today, April 3, 2018.¹ This is Yuneeq’s first request for an extension of time to respond to
23 Plaintiff’s Complaint.

1 In support of this motion, Plaintiff relies upon the memorandum of points and
2 authorities below.

3 **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

4 Under FRCP 6(b)(1)(A), a party may seek to extend a deadline prior to its expiration
5 upon a showing of “good cause.” The standard to be applied by a court under FRCP 6(b)(1) is a
6 liberal one in order to “effectuate the general purpose of seeing that cases are tried on the
7 merits.” Ahanchian v. Xenon Pictures, Inc., 624 F.3d 1253, 1258-59 (9th Cir. 2010). Good
8 cause “is a non-rigorous standard that has been construed broadly across procedural and
9 statutory contexts.” Id at 1259.
10

11 In this case, good cause exists to provide Yuneec with a short two-week extension of
12 time to respond to Plaintiff’s Complaint. Undersigned counsel, whose law firm was only just
13 today (April 3, 2018) retained by Yuneec, needs additional time to review the Complaint,
14 discuss the allegations set forth in that pleading with Yuneec’s management and formulate an
15 appropriate response. Yuneec is also represented by counsel based in California, specifically
16 Douglas Q. Hahn, Esq. and Salil Bali, Esq. of the law firm Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth,
17 P.C. Undersigned counsel has discussed the allegations set forth in Plaintiff’s Complaint with
18 Messrs. Hahn and Bali and is in the process of coordinating an appropriate response with them
19 but, as referenced above, must also ensure that Yuneec management review the response and
20 provide their input.² The additional time requested herein will provide undersigned counsel
21 sufficient time to accomplish the foregoing.

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27 ² The additional time is also needed to permit California counsel, who have a preexisting
28 attorney/client relationship with Yuneec, sufficient time to prepare an application for admission
to this Court.

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CONCLUSION

For the reasons set forth above, good cause exists to grant Defendant Yuneec a short 14-day extension of time to file a response to Plaintiff's Complaint.
