
**Order**

Pending before the Court is Air Vent's motion to extend the deadline to serve third-party Defendant Powermax Electric to March 3, 2022. Docket No. 61. No response was filed. Although good cause exists for an extension, the Court is not persuaded that such a lengthy extension is warranted based on the showing made and the current circumstances. *See* Docket No. 57-1 at ¶ 11 (representation that service in China is completed on average within seven months). Accordingly, that motion is **GRANTED** in part and **DENIED** in part. The deadline to effectuate service on Powermax Electric is **EXTENDED** to January 18, 2022.<sup>1</sup>
