ORDER

12 Pending before the Court is the Report and Recommendation (“R&R”), (ECF No. 6), of
13 United States Magistrate Judge Nancy J. Koppe, which recommends dismissing Plaintiff Aaron
14 Quincy Ingram’s (“Plaintiff’s”) Complaint, (ECF No. 1-1), for failure to either pay the filing
15 fee or file an application to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

16 A party may file specific written objections to the findings and recommendations of a
17 United States Magistrate Judge made pursuant to Local Rule IB 1-4. 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B);
18 D. Nev. R. IB 3-2. Upon the filing of such objections, the Court must make a *de novo*
19 determination of those portions to which objections are made. *Id.* The Court may accept, reject,
20 or modify, in whole or in part, the findings or recommendations made by the Magistrate Judge.
21 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1); D. Nev. R. IB 3-2(b). Where a party fails to object, however, the Court
22 is not required to conduct “any review at all . . . of any issue that is not the subject of an
23 objection.” *Thomas v. Arn*, 474 U.S. 140, 149 (1985) (citing 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)). Indeed,
24 the Ninth Circuit has recognized that a district court is not required to review a magistrate
25 judge’s R&R where no objections have been filed. *See, e.g., United States v. Reyna–Tapia*, 328
F.3d 1114, 1122 (9th Cir. 2003).

Here, no objections were filed, and the deadline to do so has passed. (*See* Min. Order,

1 ECF No. 6) (setting an August 15, 2022, deadline for objections).

2 Accordingly,

3 **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that the Report and Recommendation, (ECF No. 6), is
4 **ACCEPTED and ADOPTED** in full.

5 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Plaintiff's Complaint, (ECF No. 1-1), is dismissed
6 without prejudice.

7 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Clerk is instructed to close the case.
