16	scenario. <sup>1</sup> The Court <b>DEFERS</b> ruling on the application to proceed <i>in forma pauperis</i> . Plaintiff	
17	must file, by January 20, 2025, a written brief with robust argument explaining how the	
18	circumstances identified in this application warrant waiver of the filing fee. The brief must be	
19	supported by appropriate legal research and citation with specific application of the law to the	
20	present circumstances. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 11(b)(2).
