18 Defendants, Renee Baker, Harold Byrne, James Cox, Leslie Healer, Agnes Horn, Felix Kreskey,
19 Grant Luce, Jack Palmer, Rex Reed, Melissa Travis, Lisa Walsh, Adam Watson, Kenneth Webb and
20 Jonathan Wilson, by and through counsel, Adam Paul Laxalt, Attorney General of the State of Nevada,
21 and Benjamin R. Johnson, Deputy Attorney General, hereby move for a second enlargement of time to
22 file a dispositive motion. This Motion is based on the following Memorandum of Points and Authorities
23 and all papers and pleadings on file in this case.

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1 **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

2 **I. LAW AND ARGUMENT**

3 This is an inmate civil rights action brought pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Plaintiff Max Reed
4 (Plaintiff) is an inmate in the custody of the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC), housed at
5 Southern Desert Correctional Center. Following screening of his complaint, Defendants filed an
6 Answer on November 30, 2015. The Court issued a scheduling order (ECF No. 104 & 111) and the
7 parties participated in discovery. On January 30, 2018, the Court issued an order setting the deadline
8 for dispositive motions for May 1, 2018. (ECF No. 174).

9 Counsel previously requested an enlargement of time to file a motion for summary judgment due to
10 preparation for an evidentiary hearing in another case. Since that time, another Deputy Attorney General
11 left the Litigation Division and his cases had to be reassigned. Some of those cases had immediate
12 deadlines that required the undersigned to stop working on the motion for summary judgment in order to
13 meet those deadlines. Counsel needs a short extension of time complete a dispositive motion and finalize
14 the exhibits.

15 FED. R. CIV. P. 6(b)(1) governs enlargements of time and provides as follows:

16 When an act may or must be done within a specified time, the court may,
17 for good cause, extend the time: (A) with or without motion or notice if
18 the court acts, or if a request is made, before the original time or its
19 extension expires; or (B) on motion made after the time has expired if the
20 party failed to act because of excusable neglect.

21 The proper procedure, when additional time for any purpose is needed, is to present a request for
22 extension of time before the time fixed has expired. *Canup v. Mississippi Val. Barge Line Co.*, 31 F.R.D.
23 282 (W.D.Pa. 1962). Extensions of time may always be asked for, and usually are granted on a showing of
24 good cause if timely made under subdivision (b)(1) of the Rule. *Creedon v. Taubman*, 8 F.R.D. 268 (N.D.
25 Ohio 1947).

26 Defendants seek an enlargement of time to file a motion for summary judgment. Good cause exists
27 to extend the time to file this motion. Plaintiff will not be prejudiced by a small enlargement of time to file
28 the motion. This request is made in good faith and is not for the purposes of delay. Defendants request an
extension of ten days to file a Motion for Summary Judgment.


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
1 **II. CONCLUSION**


