

On December 15, 2016, Plaintiff filed a 96-page motion for reconsideration of this 1 Court's May 2016 screening order. (ECF No. 50.) Plaintiff objected to the dismissal of 2 some of the defendants in his case. (Id. at 2-18.) In response, Defendants argued that 3 the second amended complaint contained the same factual allegations and causes of 4 5 action as Plaintiff's first amended complaint. (ECF No. 57 at 5.) Defendants argued that 6 Plaintiff regurgitated the same factual allegations that he had previously asserted. (Id. at 7 6.) In reply, Plaintiff argued that he provided the Court with newly discovered evidence 8 which strengthened his factual allegations. (ECF No. 62 at 2.)

9 A motion to reconsider must set forth "some valid reason why the court should 10 reconsider its prior decision" and set "forth facts or law of a strongly convincing nature to persuade the court to reverse its prior decision." Frasure v. United States, 256 F.Supp.2d 11 12 1180, 1183 (D. Nev. 2003). Reconsideration is appropriate if this Court "(1) is presented with newly discovered evidence, (2) committed clear error or the initial decision was 13 manifestly unjust, or (3) if there is an intervening change in controlling law." Sch. Dist. No. 14 15 1J v. Acands, Inc., 5 F.3d 1255, 1263 (9th Cir. 1993). "A motion for reconsideration is not an avenue to re-litigate the same issues and arguments upon which the court already has 16 17 ruled." Brown v. Kinross Gold, U.S.A., 378 F.Supp.2d 1280, 1288 (D. Nev. 2005).

The Court denies the motion for reconsideration. The Court has reviewed the arguments in Plaintiff's motion and finds that the Court considered these arguments and allegations when it screened Plaintiff's first amended complaint. The Court does not find that it committed clear error in its initial decision. Additionally, Plaintiff has not provided the Court with any newly discovered evidence that would change the outcome of the screening order.

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1	II. CONCLUSION
2	For the foregoing reasons, it is ordered that the motion for reconsideration (ECF
3	No. 50) is denied.
