

1 advising the Court and Plaintiff of: (a) the names of the defendants for whom it accepts
2 service; (b) the names of the defendants for whom it does not accept service, and (c) the
3 names of the defendants for whom it is filing the last-known-address information under seal.
4 As to any of the named defendants for whom the Attorney General's Office cannot accept
5 service, the Office shall file, *under seal*, but shall not serve the inmate Plaintiff the last known
6 address(es) of those defendant(s) for whom it has such information. If the last known address
7 of the defendant(s) is a post office box, the Attorney General's Office shall attempt to obtain
8 and provide the last known physical address(es).

9 4. If service cannot be accepted for any of the named defendant(s), Plaintiff shall
10 file a motion identifying the unserved defendant(s), requesting issuance of a summons, and
11 specifying a full name and address for the defendant(s). For the defendant(s) as to which the
12 Attorney General has not provided last-known-address information, Plaintiff shall provide the
13 full name and address for the defendant(s).

14 5. If the Attorney General accepts service of process for any named defendant(s),
15 such defendant(s) shall file and serve an answer or other response to the amended complaint
16 within **sixty (60) days** from the date of this order.

17 6. Henceforth, Plaintiff shall serve upon defendant(s) or, if an appearance has been
18 entered by counsel, upon their attorney(s), a copy of every pleading, motion or other document
19 submitted for consideration by the Court. Plaintiff shall include with the original document
20 submitted for filing a certificate stating the date that a true and correct copy of the document
21 was mailed or electronically filed to the defendants or counsel for the defendants. If counsel
22 has entered a notice of appearance, Plaintiff shall direct service to the individual attorney
23 named in the notice of appearance, at the physical or electronic address stated therein. The
24 Court may disregard any document received by a district judge or magistrate judge which has
25 not been filed with the Clerk of the Court, and any document received by a district judge,
26 magistrate judge, or the Clerk of the Court which fails to include a certificate showing proper
27 service.
