



1 As a one-time courtesy, the Clerk of the Court will send Plaintiff a copy of the complaint  
2 that he submits to the Court. If Plaintiff's complaint survives screening, he may move for an  
3 extension of copy work limit because he may need to provide copies to the Court and  
4 defendants at that time. Plaintiff shall submit his complaint to this Court on or before Friday,  
5 April 22, 2016.

6 The Court further notes that Plaintiff is not required to submit exhibits with his complaint.  
7 During screening, the Court will look to the factual allegations in the complaint to determine  
8 whether or not Plaintiff has stated a cognizable claim under 42 U.S.C. § 1983. The Court  
9 warns Plaintiff that it cannot serve as a repository for the parties' evidence (i.e., prison or  
10 medical records, witness affidavits, etc.). The parties may not file evidence with the Court until  
11 the course of litigation brings the evidence into question (for example, on a motion for  
12 summary judgment, at trial, or when requested by the Court).

13 **II. CONCLUSION**

14 For the foregoing reasons, IT IS ORDERED that the motion for filing a complaint (ECF  
15 No. 4) and the motion to extend prison copy work limit (ECF No. 5) are DENIED.


16 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff shall submit a complaint to this Court on or  
17 before Friday, April 22, 2016.

18 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that when Plaintiff submits a complaint to this Court, the  
19 Clerk of the Court shall send Plaintiff an one-time courtesy copy of his submitted complaint.

20 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court shall send to Plaintiff the  
21 approved form for filing a 42 U.S.C. § 1983 complaint and instructions for the same.

22 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if Plaintiff does not timely comply with this order,  
23 dismissal of this action may result.
