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LETTER OPINION FILED WITH THE CLERK OF THE COURT

**Re: Brown v. Commissioner of Social Security
Civil Action No. 17-1123 (SDW)**

Counsel:

Before this Court is Defendant Commissioner of Social Security's ("Commissioner" or "Defendant") Motion to Dismiss Plaintiff Kenneth David Brown Jr.'s ("Plaintiff" or "Brown") Complaint for failure to exhaust administrative remedies.¹ This Court having considered the parties' submissions, having reached its decision without oral argument pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 78, for the reasons discussed below, **GRANTS** Defendant's motion.

DISCUSSION

On August 13, 2015, Plaintiff filed an application for disability insurance benefits ("DIB") and social security benefits ("SSI"). (Compl. ¶ 5; Declaration of Marie Cousins (hereinafter "Cousins' Decl.") ¶ 3.) Those claims were initially denied by the Social Security
