**DECLARATION OF
DAVID A. SCHULZ**

I, DAVID A. SCHULZ, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, do hereby declare:

1. I am a member of Levine Sullivan Koch & Schulz, L.L.P., counsel for plaintiff Associated Press (“AP”). I submit this declaration in support of AP’s opposition to defendant’s motion for partial summary judgment with respect to information withheld from certain pre-ARB transfer/release documents selected by the Department of Defense (“DOD”) as samples of a larger universe of documents sought by AP under the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”).

2. At issue on this motion is a request submitted to DOD by AP seeking information about detainees who were transferred or released by DOD from a prison at Guantanamo Bay Cuba. AP’s FOIA request was dated January 18, 2005. A true and correct copy of this request is submitted herewith as Exhibit A.

3. After AP filed this lawsuit in June 2005, DOD produced certain heavily redacted documents, but they concerned only those detainees who were transferred or released from Guantanamo after DOD convened its Administrative Review Tribunals in late 2004. When AP objected to this limitation on the information provided, DOD agreed to conduct a broader search, and to produce samples of the types of responsive documents in its possession and of the information that it intended to withhold from them. AP agreed to this approach in order to

expedite judicial review of the broad scope of information DOD indicated that it intended to withhold from the transfer/release documents.

4. On this motion AP seeks to compel the public disclosure of the facts and circumstances surrounding the release or transfer of detainees from Guantanamo to the full extent required under the FOIA. However, AP does not challenge at this time DOD's decision to withhold the following information:

- a) a handwritten note by the Deputy Secretary of Defense concerning "potential future discussions" with a foreign government (Stimson Decl. ¶ 11a);
- b) the identification of specific databases searched by CITF (Smith Decl. ¶ 15);
- c) confidential communications with DOD attorneys that would be protected in litigation under the attorney-client privilege or work-product privilege (Stimson Decl. ¶ 10b);
- d) the full ISN numbers of the released or transferred detainees (Harris Decl. ¶ 31); and
- e) the names, initials or phone numbers of DOD personnel (Stimson Decl. ¶ 8b).

5. I am also submitting this declaration to place before the Court a number of documents that are relevant to the partial motion for summary judgment and discussed in AP's memorandum of law submitted herewith.



Detainee Transfer Announced

The Department of Defense announced today that it transferred five detainees from Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, to Afghanistan. These detainees were all recommended for transfer due to multiple review processes conducted at Guantanamo Bay.

With today's transfer, approximately 120 detainees remain at Guantanamo who the U.S. government has determined eligible for transfer or release through a comprehensive series of review processes. Departure of these remaining detainees approved for transfer or release is subject to ongoing discussions between the United States and other nations. The United States does not desire to hold detainees for any longer than necessary. The department expects that there will continue to be other transfers and releases of detainees.

There are ongoing processes to review the status of detainees held at Guantanamo. A determination about the continued detention or transfer of a detainee is based on the best information and evidence available at the time, both classified and unclassified.

With this transfer, approximately 315 detainees have departed Guantanamo for other countries, including Albania, Afghanistan, Australia, Bahrain, Belgium, Denmark, Egypt, France, Germany, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Maldives, Morocco, Pakistan, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Spain, Sweden, Sudan, Tajikistan, Turkey, Uganda, United Kingdom, and Yemen.

Approximately 445 detainees remain at Guantanamo.

COMBATANT STATUS REVIEW TRIBUNAL ORDER ISSUED

The Department of Defense announced today the formation of the Combatant Status Review Tribunal for detainees held at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. This tribunal will serve as a forum for detainees to contest their status as enemy combatants.

Detainees held at Guantanamo Bay will be notified within 10 days of their opportunity to contest their enemy combatant status under this process. The tribunal process will start as soon as possible. Detainees will also be notified of their right to seek a writ of habeas corpus in the courts of the United States.

Habeas corpus is a writ ordering a person in custody to be brought before a court.

An individual tribunal will be comprised of three neutral officers, none of whom were involved with the detainee. One of the tribunal members will be a judge advocate and the senior ranking officer will serve as the president of the tribunal.

Each detainee will be assigned a military officer as a personal representative. That officer will assist the detainee in preparing for a tribunal hearing. Detainees will have the right to testify before the tribunal, call witnesses and introduce any other evidence. Following the hearing of testimony and other evidence, the tribunal will determine in a closed-door session whether the detainee is properly held as an enemy combatant. Any detainee who is determined not to be an enemy combatant will be transferred to their country of citizenship or other disposition consistent with domestic and international obligations and U.S. foreign policy.

This tribunal does not replace the administrative review procedure announced earlier this year.
