Dear Judge Swain:

We write respectfully on behalf of both plaintiffs and defendant the United States of America in the above-referenced actions to (1) present a proposed schedule for the filing of surreply briefs in the Molchatsky case, and (2) request that the Goldman and Slade Foundation cases be held in abeyance pending the Court's resolution of the pending jurisdictional motion in Molchatsky.

On May 4, 2010, the Court granted plaintiffs' request to file a sur-reply in Molchatsky, limited to 15 pages, and granted the Government an opportunity to file a 15-page response. The Court's Order, however, did not address the schedule under which these briefs should be submitted. Accordingly, the parties have conferred and respectfully propose the following schedule: plaintiffs will file their sur-reply on May 21, 2010, and the Government will file its response on June 11, 2010. Under this proposed schedule, the motion will be fully submitted two weeks prior to the conference presently scheduled for Friday, June 25, 2010.

With respect to the <u>Goldman</u> and <u>Slade Foundation</u> cases, the parties respectfully request that these cases be held in abeyance pending the Court's resolution of the United States' motion to dismiss the <u>Moltchatsky</u> case for lack of subject-matter jurisdiction. Aside from their allegations concerning the plaintiffs, the <u>Goldman</u> and <u>Slade Foundation</u> complaints are virtually

identical to the Molchatsky complaint and raise the same jurisdictional issues. Accordingly, the parties agree that, however the Court resolves the Molchatsky motion to dismiss, the Court's decision will apply equally to the Goldman and Slade Foundation complaints. The parties respectfully submit that the most efficient course of action would be to hold the Goldman and Slade Foundation cases in abeyance - including any requirement that the parties submit a Joint Pretrial Statement - pending the Court's resolution of the motion in Molchatsky.

We thank the Court for its consideration of these requests.

The proposed briefing schedule is approved. The Soldman (10 chr 2484) and Stade Foundation (10 Civ 2483) are hereby placed on the supernor calendar (with unitial pretrial confirmes and related requirements NEIL M. CORWIN adjusted sie die) pendung resolution of the Molchalstay motion to dismiss. The molchatty conforma is adjourned to July 23, 2010, out 11:00 Am.
