MOS was at work today. He slammed a sick report on the Sgt's desk & said he was going out sick. Sgt told him to stick around & he refused & left. Didn't follow procedure. Typically, they call sick desks until the command to arrange coverages. MOS was working on TIS.

MOS did not go straight home. Cops are at his home waiting for his arrival. They called MOS on his cell phone. They had to picked up & then hung up. Since they no answer they are thinking of arresting him but they suspect it is more of a psych problem. XO of MOS' command (81Bd) is Capt Lauterborn & request response from TIS. ————— C. Jantzen Pys

TCC Capt Lauterborn

MOS doing a 7-3 day tour today, at TIS all day, all was fine. He typically keeps to self & don't converse much with other officers, odd is one today. Nothing seemed out of ordinary.

2P.M - he went down to take my, charged & then put a sick report on Sgt's desk & said going sick. He wrote that he had stomach pains. Sgt tried to stop him but he left anyway.

Underlying issue - MOS has made allegation against others. Dept's investigation of those allegations picked up this week & it snowballed from there. This week, about 4PM a 2 civilian people were called down for questioning. MOS goes up to them & asks about it, notifications are in telephone message log so he knows who is going. When they return, he tries intercept them & get info from them about what he was asked. Today was 1st tour back after RDO's, not sure what happened today that triggered him to leave like that.

Delytey, seeing soft & Capt L. all left
him messages & asked him to go back to command
A Lt is at his home. His car is there.
Landlord said Mos may have been there earlier. Command
from Mos' potatoes when home. Mos not ~~there~~ here.

- I left a msg on Mos' cell phone & gave my
cell # - Capt L's cell phone. I told him that Capt
said he could just return to his home if he didn't want to
go to the command. I urged him to go home on Capt L's Capt
so this could be resolved quickly & easily. I / or need
for a Capt who will return to command for him, or display
actions like suspension. Much easier to just resolve it
quickly & easily now. I explained that Capt L is just
concerned for his safety & they want to make sure he is ok

- H/C Capt Houterborn - advised Capt that I left
msg on Mos' cell phone as described above. I suggested Capt
call Mos' father b/c that's the person he is closest to & the
person who is most likely to know his whereabouts. Capt will
call w/s when he gets a chance from Mos.

addendum to 10/31/09 note of TIC - Capt Lauterborn not appr.

1750 hours, D delayed entry made on 10/14/10, in reviewing
letter, the below info was found to not be contained in prior note, but
is clear & US' memory. Capt Lauterborn asked if Mos was
suicidal or depressed, because he needed to know how concerned they
should be about Mos' safety given his going truly not knowing where
calls, not knowing where of home but his car was there, etc. D informed
Capt that he last saw Mos at PES on 10/27/09 & at that time
he looked ok & reported being asymptomatic. At no time had he
ever expressed thoughts of suicide, but he also never was true logic
& facts the way he was acting on 10/31/09. My assessment of his
suicide risk is only as good as the last time I saw him. D recently
however after that & last him to be so upset that he left work
without permission or home before the end of his tour, said he had
stomach pains, etc, that I am unable to say with any reasonable
amount of certainty that he is not at risk of self-harm in present
circumstances. D provided Capt with brief info about reason
Mos was on R/D - that he had significant physical tx of stomach
(Monsanty G-2 Rx, Cardiac Rx, etc). Unbeknownst to Mos was
reptile operating on 10/27/09 when he said all of his Rx went away
w/o Rx, Mos stated to minimize it that he did not want to be on PRD,
he was often drowsy tired and but denied any cold Rx a subsequent
monitoring scorecard, when he expressed being upset about being on PRD, he reported
on 10/31/09 that he had stomach pains since enough to want leave and take
end of tour, so primary suspect initially the Rx were still away or
they received on 10/31/09 due to him being really upset about ending.
It is also possible there was a medical cause for the stomach pain
but the angry manner in which he left with suggests a psych cause.

d. explains to Mos. that d. called him in immediately upon return from a 2 wk vacation b/c d. was receiving treatment that his father made a complaint down the road that d. never told MOS the reason why he is on R/D. Since we had discussed that in detail at his initial & subsequent visits, d. emphatically agrees on confidentiality of how he may not have wanted to tell his father the reason why he was on R/D. To make sure that he has a clear understanding of why he is on R/D, d. again explains in detail that he is on R/D b/c he had significant physical manifestations of stress that were causing much discomfort & would benefit from treatment & further monitoring.

Mos said he no longer has these physicals of stress even though he is still facing the same stresses as before while on R/D, he is at present dealing w/ PCT daily w/ complaints all day long - not enough to him, but not any less stressful (in his opinion) as regular F/P visits.

d. again receives strength & resilience training so the next time he is faced with new/northern stresses, he won't have a recurrence of the chest pain, headache, insomnia, repeat stressors, etc., that he had for several months when he first came to PES. He said he bought both books d. recommended & started reading them, but not that lengthy since not much he didn't know before. He thought the Burns book was too long, corny & pretentious. He ~~said~~ bought both books to today's copy of Red Book, and in them, ~~he~~ ^{he} not very good with them (so hasn't read much of them). He said he called a few people of recently but was told they're extra & one word \$400/burn. I told him it could help him find an Action Project & I sure they most cover CBT for physicals & of PDX. He said he will call later & he provides # & name of his exact HMO plan so d. can make sure the provider is in-network. Mos agreed on approach of the committee.
