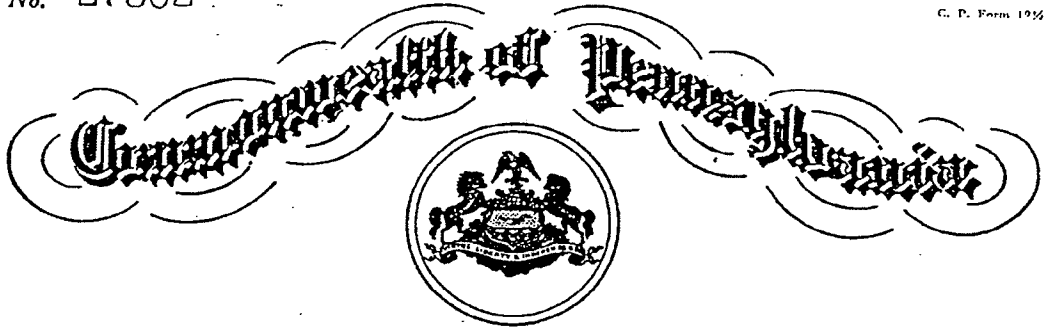

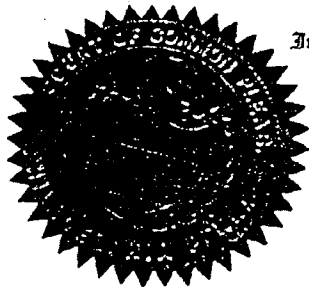
DECREE
