- 9 report, in the next to last paragraph, in the
- third to last line, "the general houses." Do
- 11 you see that?
- 12 A Uh-huh.
- 13 Q Are the general houses --
- 14 A The ones that I just named are the
- very ones that you would think of first in that
- 16 context.
- 17 Q Is general house essentially
- synonymous with a trade publisher or a general
- 19 trade publisher?
- 20 A Yeah, general trade publisher and
- general house mean the same thing, but trade
- 22 publisher does not have to be general.
- Q Trade, as you said earlier, simply
- 24 meaning somebody who sells into the book trade?
- 25 A They work through the trade, yes.
