
**SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION OF JAMES FRUCHTERMAN  
IN SUPPORT OF DEFENDANT INTERVENORS' MOTION FOR SUMMARY  
JUDGMENT**

I, James Fruchterman, do hereby declare that:

1. To reproduce and distribute high quality digital copies of texts to individuals with print disabilities, Bookshare® has found it necessary to grant employees, subcontractors and volunteers, who are primarily sighted people without print disabilities, full access to the texts of the digital books and periodicals.
2. It is a fundamental requirement for accessibility work that people without print disabilities are the primary personnel used to make accessible versions of inaccessible content. To put it simply, if blind people could easily and automatically gain full access to printed books and graphics, they wouldn't need the help of sighted people to enter, proofread, format or describe such books to create accessible versions.
