By Order dated February 21, two teleconferences were rescheduled in above-captioned matters: a teleconference related to a discovery dispute between class plaintiffs and non-party Walter Isaacson was set for February 26 at 4:00 p.m., and a second teleconference related to a discovery dispute between defendant Apple, Inc. ("Apple") and non-party Amazon ("Apple/Amazon dispute") was set for February 26 at 4:30 p.m. (the "4:30 p.m. Conference").


Three additional matters have been raised. First, by letters dated February 14 and February 19, respectively, Apple and Amazon ask the Court to redact portions of letters and exhibits submitted to the Court with respect to the Apple/Amazon dispute. Second, by letter dated February 25, class plaintiffs request the Court's assistance in settling a discovery dispute with defendants The Penguin Group, a division of Pearson PLC and Penguin Group (USA), Inc. ("Penguin"). Finally, by letters dated February 22 and February 25, respectively, Penguin and plaintiff States seek clarification regarding Penguin's participation in the June 2013 trial. It is hereby

ORDERED that Apple's February 14 redaction requests and Amazon's February 19 redaction requests are denied. Apple and Amazon will be given an opportunity at the **4:30 p.m. Conference** to explain why any of their proposed redactions should be made.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Court will also discuss at the **4:30 p.m. Conference** (i) class plaintiffs' discovery dispute with Penguin, and (ii) Penguin's participation in the June 2013 trial.
