ORDER

LORETTA A. PRESKA, Senior United States District Judge:

The Court has received the letter filed by Petitioner, dated September 20, 2024, (see dkt. no 609), requesting clarification regarding the Joint Pretrial Scheduling Order entered by the Court on June 13, 2024, (see dkt. no. 580).

The parties need not file pre-motion letters requesting a conference before formally filing any of the motions contemplated by the Joint Pretrial Scheduling Order, i.e., <u>Daubert</u> motions, motions for summary judgment, and motions <u>in limine</u> ("Pre-Trial Motions"). (<u>See</u> dkt. no. 580 ¶ 4.) By including in the Joint Pretrial Scheduling Order that the parties may file a pre-motion letter by November 29, 2024, (<u>see id.</u>), the Court merely intended to convey that a party <u>could</u> file a pre-motion letter pursuant to Individual Rule 2.A <u>in lieu</u> of a more formal memorandum of law as described in Individual Rule 2.B and Local Rule 7.1 if the party was so inclined.

Accordingly, the Court will construe either a formal notice of motion, accompanied by a memorandum of law, or a pre-motion letter as a Pre-Trial Motion under the Joint Pretrial Scheduling Order.
