JOHN G. KOELTL, District Judge:

The petitioner requests that the Court appoint counsel to represent him. (Dkt. No. 3.) Under 28 U.S.C. § 1915, the Court "may request an attorney to represent any person unable to afford counsel." 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(1). However, for the Court to order the appointment of counsel, the petitioner must, as a threshold matter, demonstrate that his claim has substance or a likelihood of success on the merits. <u>See See Hodge v. Police</u> <u>Officers</u>, 802 F.2d 58, 60-61 (2d Cir. 1986). The Court cannot make such a determination until there is further briefing of the petition on the merits. Thus, the petitioner's application for the Court to appoint counsel is **denied without prejudice**. The Clerk of Court is directed to close Docket Number 3.
